Music



Music is the art of arranging sounds in time to produce a composition through the elements of melody, harmony, rhythm, and timbre. It is one of the universal cultural aspects of all human societies. The word music is derived from Greek word (mousike; "(art) of the Muses"). In Greek mythology, the nine Muses were the goddesses who inspired literature, science, and the arts and who were the source of the knowledge embodied in the poetry, song-lyrics, and myths in the Greek culture. Music is composed and performed for many purposes, ranging from aesthetic pleasure, religious or ceremonial purposes, or as an entertainment product for the marketplace. When music was only available through sheet music scores, such as during the Classical and Romantic eras, music lovers would buy the sheet music of their favourite pieces and songs so that they could perform them at home on the piano.

Composition is the act or practice of creating a song, an instrumental music piece, a work with both singing and instruments, or another type of music. In many cultures, including Western classical music, the act of composing also includes the creation of music notation, such as a sheet music "score", which is then performed by the composer or by other singers or musicians. In popular music and traditional music, the act of composing, which is typically called songwriting, may involve the creation of a basic outline of the song, called the lead sheet, which sets out the melody, lyrics and chord progression. In classical music, the composer typically orchestrates his or her own compositions, but in musical theatre and in pop music, songwriters may hire an arranger to do the orchestration. In some cases, a songwriter may not use notation at all, and instead compose the song in her mind and then play or record it from memory. In jazz and popular music, notable recordings by influential performers are given the weight that written scores play in classical music. In the 2000s, music notation typically means the written expression of music notes and rhythms on paper using symbols. When music is written down, the pitches and rhythm of the music, such as the notes of a melody, are notated. Music notation also often provides instructions on how to perform the music. For example, the sheet music for a song may state that the song is a "slow blues" or a "fast swing", which indicates the tempo and the genre. To read music notation, a person must have an understanding of music theory, harmony and the performance practice associated with a particular song or piece's genre. Musical texture is the overall sound of a piece of music or song. The texture of a piece or song is determined by how the melodic, rhythmic, and harmonic materials are combined in a composition, thus determining the overall nature of the sound in a piece. Texture is often described in regard to the density, or thickness, and range, or width, between lowest and highest pitches, in relative terms as well as more specifically distinguished according to the number of voices, or parts, and the relationship between these voices (see common types below). For example, a thick texture contains many 'layers' of instruments. One of these layers could be a string section, or another brass. Expressive qualities are those elements in music that create change in music without changing the main pitches or substantially changing the rhythms of the melody and its accompaniment.

Performers, including singers and instrumentalists, can add musical expression to a song or piece by adding phrasing, by adding effects such as vibrato (with voice and some instruments, such as guitar, violin, brass instruments and woodwinds), dynamics (the loudness or softness of piece or a section of it), tempo fluctuations (e.g., *ritardando* or *accelerando*, which are, respectively slowing down and speeding up the tempo), by adding pauses or fermatas on a cadence, and by changing the articulation of the notes (e.g., making notes more pronounced or accented, by making notes more legato, which means smoothly connected, or by making notes shorter). Prehistoric music can only be theorized based on findings from paleolithic archaeology sites. Flutes are often discovered, carved from bones in which lateral holes have been pierced; these are thought to have been blown at one end like the Japanese shakuhachi. The Divje Babe flute, carved from a cave bear femur, is thought to be at least 40,000 years old. Instruments such as the seven-holed flute and various types of stringed instruments, such as the Ravanahatha, have been recovered from the Indus Valley Civilization archaeological sites. India has one of the oldest musical traditions in the world—references to Indian classical music (*marga*) are found in the Vedas, ancient scriptures of the Hindu tradition. The earliest and largest collection of prehistoric musical instruments was found in China and dates back to between 7000 and 6600 BC. The "Hurrian Hymn to Nikkal", found on clay tablets that date back to approximately 1400 BC, is the oldest surviving notated work of music. The music that composers and songwriters make can be heard through several media; the most traditional way is to hear it live, in the presence of the musicians (or as one of the musicians), in an outdoor or indoor space such as an amphitheatre, concert hall, cabaret room, theatre, pub, or coffeehouse. Since the 20th century, live music can also be broadcast over the radio, television or the Internet, or recorded and listened to on a CD player or Mp3 player.

CHOCOLATE CARAMEL FLAN

1) I first make the chocolate batter

Step 2 : Add 200 ml of milk And mix nicely

2) We make cream caramel

In a mixer add :

- Evaporated milk- 600 ml
- Condensed milk - 1 whole can
- Eggs - 4
- Vanilla extract- 1 tbsp

3) And whip to make custard Grease and flour your pot.

In your baking pot put an even layer of shop bought salted caramel. Then put an even layer of the cake batter on the top of salted caramel. Take the back of the spoon and pour the creme caramel on the back of the spoon so it is distributed evenly. Keep your pot in a tray with a towel to stop it from moving while baking.

Add boiling water in the tray and bake for 180° C for 1 hour.

Once baked the cake will be on top and the caramel below.

And your cake is ready.

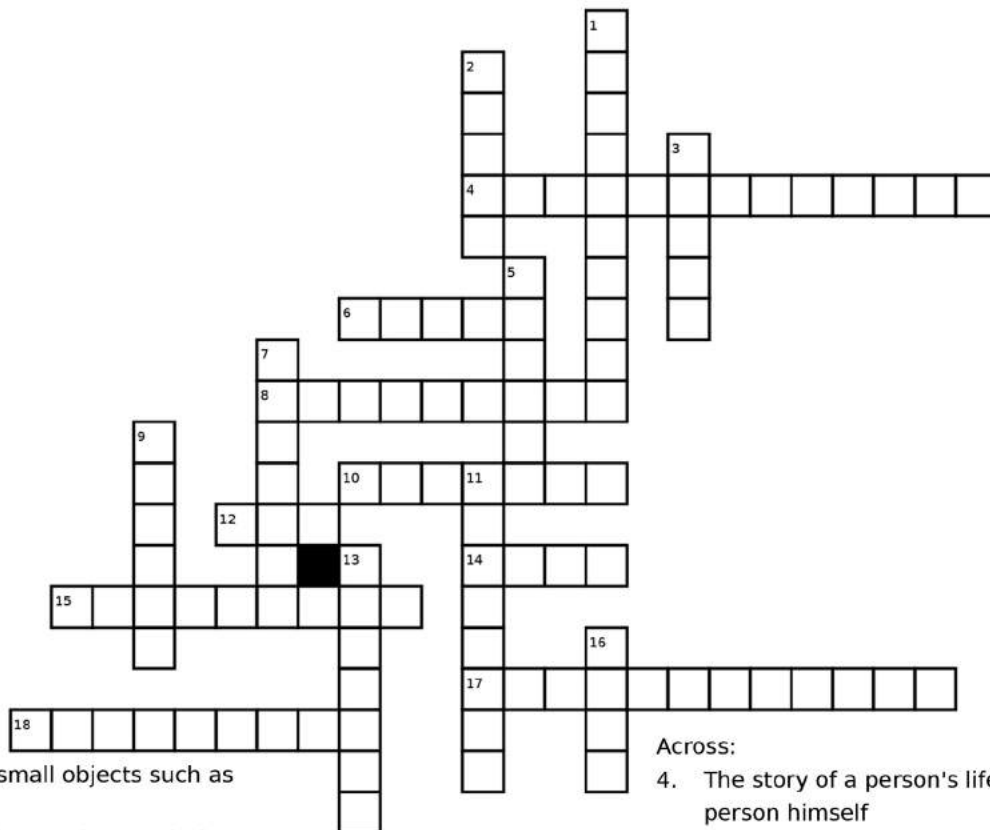

Pleased to learn that there was a resource available to provide services for teachers, the Vice Principal of New Horizon International School made plans to initiate a Stress Management Program for teachers. Teachers were also excited about participating in training that was designed for their well-being as it really benefited us from new knowledge and skills for managing our own stress.

This program was organised by Shikshangan Education Initiatives and initiated by their Directors ,Ms Devika Nadig and Mr Vijay Gupta on April 9 2021 and these are some of the effective points that really guided us in an effective way.

Ms Devika spoke on how the pandemic situation makes it difficult for teaching and academic loss is bound to put a lot of pressure on teachers juggling online teaching from home and sometimes from school, and also maintaining their responsibilities-, both professional and personal.

She also focussed on prioritization of work according to the urgency level such as emergency, less important work that can be postponed, entertainment etc. Moreover, she shed light on 'Johari Window'- comprised of four quadrants of cognitive skills of Time management:

1. Managing
- 2.Planning and Executing
- 3.Effective communication
4. Leisure time

The seven strategies explained by her for dealing with stress like -Reading your favourite book; breathing exercise and yoga; dividing work as per urgency; spending time with positive people; prioritise time for own; spending time with positive people; help needy people had really simplified our thoughts to much extent.


